정답: ③ (c) enhance → jeopardize

[정답 해설]

해석: 발자크의 이야기는 환경에 대한 정교한 묘사로 시작하지만, 이러한 설명들은 허구의 세계를 통과하는 정확한 경로를 따르기 때문에 독자의 방향 감각을 결코 위협하지 않는다.

문맥상 발자크의 묘사가 독자의 방향 감각을 '위협하거나 해치지 않는다'는 내용이 되어야 하므로, '향상시키다'라는 뜻의 enhance는 적절하지 않다. 이를 jeopardize(위협하다)나 threaten으로 고쳐야 논리적으로 자연스럽다.

고 무작위적인 방식(disorganized and random fashion)'으로 탐색한다는 3번은 내용과 일치하지 않는다.

해석: 발자크의 소설에서 화자는 종종 무질서하고 무작위적인 방식으로 배경을 탐색한다.

[정답 해설]

발자크의 기법은 '체계적인(systematic/methodical)' 순서로 묘사하며, 이를 통해 독자가 '방향 감각(orientation/direction)'을 유지할 수 있게 한다.

해석: 즉각적인 시각화를 제공하는 그림과 달리, 발자크의 문학적 방법은 움직임과 연결된 체계적인 묘사 순서를 사용하여 독자들이 가상의 배경 내에서 자신의 방향 감각을 유지할 수 있게 한다.

[정답 해설]

해석: 그림이 관객을 즉각적으로 풍경 속으로 이동시키는 반면, 단어들은 그것을 하나씩 묘사하며 독자의 의식 속에 서서히 도입한다.

(b)가 포함된 절(words ~ consciousness)에서 words가 주어이므로, 문장을 완결하기 위해서는 현재분사인 depicting이 아니라 정형동사인 depict가 필요하다. (a)는 단수 주어 image에 호응하는 동사이며, (c)는 형용사 able을 수식하는 to부정사, (d)는 주어 A remedy에 대한 본동사, (e)는 복수 주어 they에 호응하는 병렬 구조의 동사로 모두 어법상 적절하다.

[정답 해설]

해석: 그림은 즉각적이지만 언어는 점진적이라는 도입부 뒤에, (B)에서 어떻게 문학이 길을 잃지 않고 장소를 묘사할 수 있는지 질문을 던진다. (A)에서 발자크가 제안한 '움직이는 몸'이라는 해결책을 제시하고, (C)에서 실제 집을 묘사하는 구체적인 예시와 그 결과를 설명하며 마무리하는 것이 논리적이다.

정답: ②

[정답 해설]

해석: 발자크가 제안한 해결책은 묘사 요소를 움직이는 몸과 연결하는 것을 포함한다.

주어진 문장은 문학 묘사의 한계를 극복하기 위한 발자크의 '해결책(remedy)'을 소개하고 있다. 따라서 이 문장은 묘사의 어려움에 대해 질문을 던지는 문장(①번 앞 문장) 뒤에 오고, 그 해결책이 구체적으로 어떻게 작용하는지 설명하는 문장(②번 뒤 문장) 앞에 위치하는 것이 가장 적절하다.
